Property Description and Background:

The subject property is a 40,511 sq. ft. land parcel located at 960 Meridian Road N.E. The assessment is \$930,000 for 2010 based on a land rate of \$22.95 per sq. ft. The Complaint indicated that the land is assessed beyond its market value.

<u>lssues:</u>

1. Is the subject property assessed in excess of it market value as of July 1, 2009?

Board's Decision in Respect of Each Matter or Issue:

1. The subject assessment is not in excess of its market value as of July 1, 2009.

Overview of the Positions of the Parties

The Complainant had reviewed their evidence again prior to the hearing and advised the CARB that the evidence is unlikely to be persuasive. Both parties agreed that the CARB should confirm the assessment

Reason for the Decision

While both parries submitted their evidence neither made any oral representations to the CARB based on the evidence submitted.

Decision Summary

Based on the foregoing the decision of the CARB is to confirm the assessment for the subject property at \$ 930,000.

An appeal may be made to the Court of Queen's Bench on a question of law or jurisdiction with respect to a decision of an assessment review board.

Any of the following may appeal the decision of an assessment review board:

- (a) the complainant;
- (b) an assessed person, other than the complainant, who is affected by the decision;
- (c) the municipality, if the decision being appealed relates to property that is within the boundaries of that municipality;
- (d) the assessor for a municipality referred to in clause (c).

An application for leave to appeal must be filed with the Court of Queen's Bench within 30 days after the persons notified of the hearing receive the decision, and notice of the application for leave to appeal must be given to

- (a) the assessment review board, and
- (b) any other persons as the judge directs.
